Referring Physician: ELENA BRODSKY

History: Pancreatic cystic disease and an elevated CA 19-9.

Procedure: MAC anesthesia was provided with standard monitoring. The radial echoendoscope was passed and the pancreas was scanned. There was a 3 cm complex cyst in the head, and a very impressive even larger complex lesion in the body. This large lesion was associated with solid mass, measuring at least 2cm, and the entire structure involved the mesenteric vein. The linear echoendoscope was passed to the duodenum and the mass was identified. FNA x 7 passes was made and in room cytologic review was carried out. The cytology appeared to be consistent with carcinoma and the procedure was terminated.

Impression: Degenerated cystic pancreatic mass consistent with carcinoma. Final review of the slides by the pathologist will be performed and a formal pathologic report will be forwarded.
